
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# **Fetal Heart Rate Monitoring**

This fourth edition provides the obstetrical team a framework within which to interpret and understand fetal heart rate tracings and their implications. The text covers key issues as the physiological basis for monitoring, a discussion of fetal hypoxemia and neonatal encephalopathy, instrumentation and pattern recognition. Â In addition to an in-depth review of the standardized NICHD nomenclature and three-tiered FHR Category approach, there are chapters on intrapartum and antepartum management as well as fetal central nervous system effects on monitor patterns. Since fetal monitoring is primarily a screening tool there are also discussions on the use of backup methods for evaluation of abnormal patterns. This 4th edition also brings the addition of Lisa A. Miller CNM, JD, who provides a nursing and midwifery perspective as well an enhanced legal and risk management review. Unfortunately, old terms that are not supported by the 2008 NICHD definitions are used in this book. I was so disappointed. It is inconsistent, An example is the book does not consistently define absent variability. Sometimes it is defined as undetectable (consistent with the NICHD definitions) and then sometimes it says it is 0-3 or 0-5. My overall impression was that some of the chapters were current (those by Lisa Miller) and the others had not be updated.
